- One load of sludge was hauled away.


2. Water Treatment and Distribution System

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Item 3.A.iii

Staff Activity – Report on Staff activities for the month of January 2020. Regular activities performed by District staff include:

Processing of utility payments, customer service duties, answering phone calls, mailing of the regular monthly utility bills. Prepared and distributed the agenda and Board packet.

Staff also attended to the following items:

- Responded to five (5) public records requests.
- Assisted William Maurer with documents related to his appointment to the Board.
- Handled parking enforcement issues.

Updates on District Grants:

LCP Grant – LCP Amendment Grant (Coastal Hazards Response Plan): The SSCSD has been preliminarily awarded this grant and is working with the County of SLO and the Coastal Commission on meeting the administrative requirements to process the grant. The District and Oliveira Environmental submitted the required Draft Work Program to the Coastal Commission that outlines the proposed CHRP project, including a proposed schedule and budget. The Coastal Commission staff is working on reviewing the Work Program and we expect to get a response soon. In the meantime, the District has received a template for the required contract language for the grant that is being reviewed by District Counsel in coordination with the County of SLO.

NFWF Grant – NFWF Grant (Creek Enhancement and Coastal Hazards Response Plan): The SSCSD has been notified that the grant application has been preliminarily approved pending a final approval process. The NFWF grant administrator told the SSCSD that they are working on the next steps and will be in contact with the District and Oliveira Environmental soon with the process for final funding. It is important to note that the NFWF grant comes with a requirement for matching funds in the amount of \$125,000. However, contact has been made with Justine Kimball, Ph.D. from the Ocean Protection Council (OPC) regarding assistance with meeting the matching funds requirement of the NFWF grant. OPC is working on getting a grant agreement in place and is working with the District on information needs to fulfill their application process (anticipated to take approximately 2 months).

Prop 1 Grant Update - There are no updates regarding this item.

Project Updates:

Disadvantaged Community Survey (MHI) – Staff had a conference call with SUSP and is currently working to prepare a customer mailing list. SUSP wants to survey individuals (including renters) who live in the service area six months out of the year or more or "full-time." Staff will continue to provide updates as information becomes available.

2000 series policy and procedures manual – There are no updates to this item. Staff will began working on this item within the first quarter of 2020.

PG&E potential power outages and emergency measures update – Staff has mailed a request for proposal (RFP) for electrical engineering and specification services related to installation of the RO building portable generator.

Coastal Development Permit (CDP) Special Conditions Update – Oliveria Consulting continues to perform Special Condition tasks. Attached is an updated time line.

Special Condition # 8 Update Payment to UC Davis Wildlife Health Program – A check was mailed to the UC Davis Regent office on January 15, 2020. We were emailed confirmation that the payment had been received. All paperwork and correspondence related to this matter has been documented for the Coastal Development Permit (CDP) file.

County Wide Hazardous Mitigation Plan – SLO County continues progress on this item.

Item 4.C. Adoption of Resolution 20-417. A resolution authorizing destruction of certain district records.

Summary:

During the February 13, 2019 regular Board meeting, the Board approved Resolution 19-407 which adopted a records retention schedule. California Government Code Section 60201 allows special districts to adopt, by resolution, a record retention schedule that classifies all the district's records by category and establishes a standard protocol for retention and destruction of records.

Although Resolution 19-407 authorizes staff to destroy records pursuant to the record retention schedule *without further Board approval*, staff prefers to have a public record when any documents are destroyed. The public record (via this resolution) provides for greater transparency and an easy way for staff in the future to track when certain documents were destroyed.

Since Board authorization for the destruction of these records is merely to provide a tracking mechanism, staff believes doing this on the Consent Agenda is appropriate.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board adopt Resolution 20-417 through the Consent Agenda. Since a Resolution is included on the Consent Agenda, the vote should be taken as a Roll Call Vote.

WHEREAS, District shall permanently maintain a list, by category, of the types of records destroyed that reasonably identifies the information contained in the records of each category.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Simeon Community Services District Board of Directors hereby grants the General Manager and designee authorization to destroy records (documents, etc.) specified in Exhibit "A".



INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors San Simeon Community Services District San Simeon, CA

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying basic financial statements of San Simeon Community Services District (District) as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2019, and the related notes to the basic financial statements, as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Opinion

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the San Simeon Community Services District, as of June 30, 2019, and the changes in financial position and cash flows thereof for the fiscal year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Other Matters

Required Supplementary Information

Management has omitted management's discussion and analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require to be presented to supplement the basic financial statements. Such missing information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board, who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial

statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. Our opinion on the basic financial statements is not affected by this missing information.

Other Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements that collectively comprise the District's basic financial statements. The introductory section and the schedules of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position by function on pages 15 and 16 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements.

Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basis financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedules of revenues, expenses, and changes in net position by function are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

The introductory section has not been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, accordingly, we do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on it.

Other Reporting Required by Government Auditing Standards

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we have also issued our report dated December XX, 2019, on our consideration of the San Simeon Community Services District's internal control over financial reporting and on our tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other matters. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards in considering the District's internal control over financial reporting and compliance.

Report on Summarized Comparative Information

We have previously audited the District's basic financial statements as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, and our report dated January 2, 2019, expressed an unmodified opinion on those audited financial statements. In our opinion, the summarized comparative information presented herein as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, is consistent, in all material respects, with the audited financial statements from which it has been derived.

SAN SIMEON COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT NOTES TO BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

June 30, 2019

NOTE 1- NATURE OF DISTRICT

San Simeon Community Services District (the "District") is a political subdivision of the State of California and operates under a council form of government. The District administers the following community services as provided by its charter: water, sanitation, streets, lighting, weed abatement, and general and administrative services.

The District is a Community Services District as defined under State Code Section: 61000. A Community Services District is a public agency (State Code Section: 12463.1) which is a State instrumentality (State Code Section: 23706). State instrumentalities are exempt from federal and state income taxes.

There are no component units included in this report which meet the criteria of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 14, *The Financial Reporting Entity*, as amended by GASB Statements No. 39, No. 61, and No. 80.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- A. Accounting Policies The accounting policies of the District conform with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America as prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA).
- B. <u>Basis of Accounting</u> The District is organized as an Enterprise Fund and follows the accrual method of accounting, whereby revenues are recorded as earned, and expenses are recorded when incurred.
- C. <u>Budget</u> Although a budget is adopted annually, it is used primarily as a guideline for the Board in regulating expenditures. There is no legal requirement to stay within the adopted budget in the payment or classification of expenditures.
- D. Cash and Cash Equivalents Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand and in banks and short-term, highly liquid investments with a maturity of three months or less, which include money market funds, cash management pools in County Treasury and the state Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF). Cash held in the county and state pooled funds is carried at cost, which approximates fair value. Interest earned is deposited quarterly into the participant's fund. Any investment losses are proportionately shared by all funds in the pool. The County is authorized to deposit cash and invest excess funds by California Government Code Section 53648 et seq. The funds maintained by the County are either secured by federal depository insurance or are collateralized.
- E. <u>Property, Plant and Equipment</u> Capital assets purchased by the District are recorded at cost. Contributed or donated capital assets are recorded at fair value when acquired.
- F. <u>Depreciation</u> Capital assets purchased by the District are depreciated over their estimated useful lives (ranging from 5-50 years) under the straight-line method of depreciation.
- G. <u>Receivables</u> The District did not experience any significant bad debt losses; accordingly, no provision has been made for doubtful accounts, and accounts receivable is shown at full value.
- H. <u>Encumbrances</u> Encumbrances represent commitments related to unperformed contracts for goods or services. Encumbrance accounting, under which purchase orders, contracts, and other commitments for the expenditure of resources are recorded to reserve that portion of the applicable appropriation, is not utilized by the District.
- Customer Deposits Customer deposits are recorded as a liability of the District. The District requires an advance deposit of \$50 for new customers.
- J. Net Position GASB Statement No. 63 requires that the difference between assets added to the deferred outflows of resources and liabilities added to the deferred inflows of resources be reported as net position. Net position is classified as either net investment in capital assets, restricted, or unrestricted.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

- J. Net Position (Continued) Net investment in capital assets consist of capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation, and reduced by the outstanding principal of related debt. Restricted net position is the net position that has external constraints placed on them by creditors, grantors, contributors, laws, or regulations of other governments, or through constitutional investment in capital assets or restricted net position.
- K. <u>Estimates</u> The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, as prescribed by the GASB and the AICPA, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the results could differ from those estimates.
- L. <u>Comparative Data/Total Only</u> Comparative total data for the prior fiscal year has been presented in certain accompanying financial statements in order to provide an understanding of the changes in the District's financial position, operations, and cash flows. Also, certain prior fiscal amounts have been reclassified to conform to the current fiscal year financial statements presentation.

The District categorizes its fair value measurements within the fair value hierarchy established by generally accepted accounting principles. The hierarchy is based on the valuation inputs used to measure the fair value of the asset. Level 1 inputs are quoted prices in active markets for identical assets; Level 2 inputs are significant other observable inputs; Level 3 inputs are significant unobservable inputs. The District had investments in the San Luis Obispo County Investment Pool and the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF), however, these external pools are not measured under Level 1, 2, or 3.

Restricted cash

Restricted cash consists of funds that are set aside for well refurbishment as well as appurtenant equipment and structure.

Disclosures Relating to Interest Rate Risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that changes in market interest rates will adversely affect the fair value of an investment. Generally, the longer the maturity of an investment, the greater the sensitivity of its fair value to changes in market interest rates. One of the ways that the District manages its exposure to interest rate risk is by purchasing a combination of shorter term and longer term investments and by timing cash flows from maturities so that a portion of the portfolio is maturing or coming close to maturity evenly over time as necessary to provide the cash flow and liquidity needed for operations.

Generally, credit risk is the risk that an issuer of an investment will not fulfill its obligation to the holder of the investment. This is measured by the assignment of rating by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization. Concentration of Credit Risk

The investment policy of the District contains no limitations on the amount that can be invested in any one issuer beyond that stipulated by the California Government Code. There are no investments in any one issuer that represent 5% or more of total District's investments

Custodial Credit Risk

Custodial credit risk for deposits is the risk that, in the event of the failure of a depository financial institution, a government will not be able to recover its deposits or will not be able to recover collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. The California Government Code and the District's investment policy do not contain legal or policy requirements that would limit the exposure to custodial credit risk for deposits, other than the following provision for deposits: The California Government Code requires that a financial institution secure deposits made by state or local governmental units by pledging securities in an undivided collateral pool held by a depository regulated under state law (unless so waived by the governmental unit). The fair value of the pledged securities in the collateral pool must equal at least 110% of the total amount deposited by the public agencies. California law also allows financial institutions to secure the District's deposits by pledging first trust deed mortgage notes having a value of 150% of the secured public deposits.

None of the District's deposits with financial institutions in excess of federal depository insurance limits were held in uncollateralized accounts.

The custodial credit risk for *investments* is the risk that, in the event of the failure of the counterparty (e.g., broker-dealer) to a transaction, a government will not be able to recover the value of its investment or collateral securities that are in the possession of another party. The California Government Code and the District's investment policy do not contain legal or policy requirements that would limit the exposure to custodial credit risk for investments. With respect to investments, custodial credit risk generally applies

only to direct investments in marketable securities. Custodial credit risk does not apply to a local government's indirect investment in securities through the use of mutual funds or government investment pools (such as LAIF and San Luis Obispo County Treasurer).

Investment in State Investment Pool

The District is a voluntary participant in the Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) that is regulated by the California Government Code under the oversight of the Treasurer of the State of California. The fair value of the District's investment in this pool is reported in the accompanying basic financial statements at the amounts based upon the District's pro-rata share of the fair value provided by LAIF for the entire LAIF portfolio (in relation to the amortized cost of that portfolio). The balance available for withdrawal is based on the accounting records maintained by LAIF, which are recorded on an amortized cost basis.

The hook-up deposits are from customers on a waiting list to connect into the system. Each deposit represents total hook-up fees owed by the customer based on the fee schedule in place at the time of the payment. Additional fees may be required from the customer, based on the current fee schedule, when the utility connection is completed.

Customer meter deposits consist of a \$50 refundable deposit required for each metered customer before any service can be provided by the District.

NOTE 6 - LOAN PAYABLE

On July 11, 2011, the District applied for a \$500,000 loan from the United States Department of Agriculture. The loan was approved, and the District began to draw on the loan during the 13/14 fiscal year. The District is required to make semi-yearly payments of \$10,345. The agreement is secured by a first lien and a pledge or revenues from the water system. In the event of a default by the District, the remaining amount of the note shall become due. NOTE 8 - JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

The District is a member of the Special District Risk Management Authority (S.D.R.M.A.), an intergovernmental risk sharing joint powers authority, created pursuant to California Government Code Sections 6500 et. Seq. In becoming a member of the S.D.R.M.A., the District elected to participate in the risk financing program(s) listed below for the program period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

General and Auto Liability, Public Officials' and Employees' Errors, and Employment Practices Liability and Employee Benefits Liability: Special District Risk Management Authority, coverage number LCA SDRMA 201112. This covers \$2,500,000 per occurrence, subject to policy deductibles.

Employee Dishonesty Coverage: Special District Risk Management Authority, coverage number EDC SDRMA 201112. This policy includes a \$400,000 Public Employee Dishonesty Blanket Coverage.

Property Loss: Special District Risk Management Authority, coverage number PPC SDRMA 201112. This policy covers the replacement cost for property on file, \$1,000,000,000 per occurrence, subject to policy deductibles.

The District also participated in the elective comprehension/collision coverage on selected vehicles, subject to policy deductibles.

Personal Liability Coverage for Board Members: This policy covers \$500,000 per occurrence, coverage number LCA SDRMA 201112, annual segregate per each selected/appointed official, subject to policy deductibles.

Members are subject to dividends and/or assessments, in accordance with Second Amended Joint Powers Agreement and amendments thereto, on file with the District. No such dividends have been declared, nor have any assessments been levied.

NOTE 9 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION

The District has an agreement with Grace Environmental Services to oversee the daily operations of the District. San Simeon Community Services District paid \$598,028 for their services during the 18/19 fiscal year.

NOTE 10 - CONTINGENCIES

According to the District's staff and attorney, no contingent liabilities are outstanding and no lawsuits are pending of any real financial consequence.

BUSINESS ACTION ITEM STAFF REPORT

Item 5.B. Authorization for the General Manager to obtain RRM Design Group to perform tasks related to the activation of solid waste power from the Local Area Formation Committee (LAFCO) on behalf of the District.

Summary:

During the November 13, 2019 regular Board meeting, Staff presented information related to the District obtaining solid waste authority from the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). The annual franchise fee amount is approximately \$ 27,375.00. This money goes directly to San Luis Obispo County. If the District chooses to obtain this power, these funds would go directly to the District. The funds could be placed into the District's general fund. The Board directed Staff to obtain quotes related to the administration of obtaining this power.

Staff contacted three entities to obtain quotes. WSC, RRM Design Group, and Oliveira Environmental Consulting (OEC). WSC declined to submit a bid for this project.

The process to activate this authority, would be similar to the process used to obtain weed abatement authority. There will be a proposition 218 process that District staff is responsible for administering.

Recommendation:

Staff is recommending that the contract be awarded to RRM Design Group not to exceed the amount of \$9,000.00.

Based on our conversation last month and again on Thursday morning, you are looking for assistance with preparing and processing applications with the County of San Luis Obispo regarding the provision of solid waste services for the San Simeon Community Services District (CSD). Formally this process is known as an activation of powers for the CSD. The goal of these applications to the San Luis Obispo County LAFCO is to divest the CSD from the umbrella of the County to be the sole provider of solid waste services as an "active power". This change would have positive economic changes for the CSD as a proportion of current revenue now goes to the County of SLO although the CSD is responsible for and oversees solid waste services.

EXHIBIT A-1

General Provisions and Conditions

The following are the terms and conditions under which RRM Design Group agrees to provide professional services to Client. This Exhibit is intended to supplement the Prime Agreement to which it is attached, and together with any other attached exhibits and/or schedules shall comprise the complete agreement (the "Agreement"). Capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Agreement. In the event of an inconsistency between this Exhibit and the Agreement, the terms and conditions of this Exhibit shall govern.

EMPLOYEE RATES (HOURLY). Unless otherwise agreed in advance, the fees for professional services performed by RRM Design Group shall be performed on a time and materials basis at RRM Design Group's then-current rates for such work. Schedule I attached hereto and incorporated by this reference sets forth a description of RRM Design Group's standard hourly rates for its employees as of the date of this Agreement. Hourly rates may vary according to employee experience and proficiency. Hourly rates for expert witness services or depositions shall be subject to a premium of 2x the standard hourly rate. Overtime for non-exempt employees, if requested by Client, shall be charged at 1.25x the standard hourly rate.

SUBCONSULTANT EXPENSES. The fee for subconsultants of RRM Design Group shall be actual cost plus 10% to cover RRM Design Group's overhead and administrative expenses. Typical subconsultants may include, but are not limited to:

Structural Engineer, Irrigation Consultant,
Geotechnical Consultant, Mechanical Engineer, Cost
Estimator, Archaeological Consultant, Electrical
Engineer, Soils Consultant, Traffic Consultant
RRM Design Group shall not be responsible or liable for
subconsultants' data, interpretations, and/or
recommendations.

REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES. Clients shall reimburse RRM Design Group for all incidental expenses incurred by RRM Design Group, or any subconsultant it may hire to perform services for the Project, at actual cost plus 10% to cover its overhead and administrative expenses.

Reimbursable expenses shall include, but are not limited to, reproduction costs, postage, shipping and handling of drawings and documents, long distance communications, fees paid to authorities having jurisdiction over the Project, the expense of any additional insurance requested by Client in excess of that normally carried by RRM Design Group or by its subconsultants, travel expenses (transportation/automobile/lodging/meals), renderings, and models. Reimbursable automobile travel mileage will be billed at the then-current IRS business standard mileage rate.

RRM DESIGN GROUP REPRODUCTIONS.

Photocopies shall be charged at a rate of \$.20 per copy. All other types of RRM Design Group reproductions including, but not limited to, blueprinting, process camera, typesetting, printing, and plotting, shall be billed at RRM Design Group's internal price sheet or, in the case of work sent to outside vendors, at the local vendor's current rate plus 10% to cover RRM Design Group's overhead and administrative expenses.

FEES AND PAYMENTS. Fees for employee rates, subconsultant expenses, reimbursable expenses, and RRM Design Group reproductions shall be billed to Client on an "as-performed basis," unless otherwise agreed by the parties in advance. PAYMENT SHALL BE DUE AND PAYABLE UPON PRESENTATION. In order to defray carrying charges resulting from delayed payments, a finance charge at 1.5% (or the maximum rate allowed by law, whichever is less) per month shall be added to the unpaid balance after thirty (30) days from the date of RRM Design Group's invoice. RRM Design Group, without any liability to Client, reserves the right to withhold services and work product pending payment of Client's outstanding indebtedness or advance payment as required by RRM Design Group.

ADVANCE PAYMENT. RRM Design Group reserves the right, from time to time, to require payment in advance for work estimated to be done during a given billing period.

COMMENCEMENT OF WORK. RRM Design Group's work will commence immediately upon receipt of Client's retainer and/or a notice to proceed signed by Client. If notice to proceed is delayed beyond thirty (30) days, it is understood that the terms and conditions of this Agreement are subject to revision.

TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION. Either party may terminate or suspend this Agreement upon seven (7) days prior written notice if the other party materially breaches or fails to perform any provision of this



Agreement and fails within seven (7) days after receipt of written notice from the non-breaching party to commence, and continue, correction of such breach with diligence and promptness. Failure of Client to make payments to RRM Design Group when due in accordance with this Agreement shall constitute a material breach of this Agreement and cause for termination or, at RRM Design Group's option, cause for suspension of performance of services. In the event of a suspension or termination of services as a result of Client's failure to pay, RRM Design Group shall have no further obligation or liability for loss or damage incurred by Client, including, but not limited to, damage caused by delay, loss of agency approvals, loss of financing, or interest expenses, because of such suspension or termination of service. Before resuming services, RRM Design Group shall be paid all sums due prior to suspension and any expenses incurred in the interruption and resumption of RRM Design Group's services. RRM Design Group's fees for the remaining services and the time schedules shall be adjusted equitably by RRM Design Group.

Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, RRM Design Group shall be entitled to immediately, and without notice, suspend the performance of any and all its obligations pursuant to this Agreement if Client files a voluntary petition seeking relief under the United States Bankruptcy Code or if there is an involuntary petition filed against Client in the United States Bankruptcy Court and that petition is not dismissed within fifteen (15) days of its filing. Any suspension of services made pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph shall continue until such time as this Agreement had been fully and properly assumed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the United States Bankruptcy Code and in compliance with the final order or judgment issued by the Bankruptcy Court. If the suspension of services continues for a period in excess of ninety (90) days, RRM Design Group shall have the right to terminate all services pursuant to this Agreement.

ADDITIONAL SERVICES. Client agrees that if Client requests services not specified in the scope of services described in this Agreement, Client will pay for all such additional services on a time and materials basis as extra services in accordance with the Employee Rates and Subconsultant Expenses described above, and any other provisions of this Agreement. Client agrees to reimburse RRM Design Group at its then-current standard rates for any unreimbursed costs it incurs to comply with any request or subpoena by any attorney, legal authority, agency, or court of law to provide records, testimony, depositions, or any other form of

information related to any legal action involving Client in which RRM Design Group is not a named party.

ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS. RRM Design Group shall not be required to execute any document subsequent to the signing of this Agreement that might in any way, in the judgment of RRM Design Group, breach RRM Design Group's contractual or legal obligations or put at risk the availability or costs of its professional (if any) or general liability insurance.

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. RRM Design Group's liability for damages arising from any claimed error, omission or other professional negligence shall be limited to \$25,000 or the fee to be paid by Client for the scope of work described in this agreement, whichever is greater. At Client's election, RRM Design Group will waive this limitation of liability in consideration of the payment by Client of the greater of \$500.00 or 10% of the estimated (or agreed upon) cost of the scope of work described in this Agreement. This provision shall apply to all work performed by RRM Design Group, and its employees, agents, retained consultants, subconsultants, subcontractors, affiliates and representatives in connection with this Agreement, whether or not the entire scope of such work is described herein. Client's fee for such waiver shall be payable in full within seven (7) days after execution of this agreement. Failure to remit payment within such period shall render null and void Client's election to purchase such waiver of limitation. CLIENT'S ELECTION TO PURCHASE A WAIVER OF LIMITATION OF LIABILITY SHOULD BE INDICATED BY INITIALING HERE: _

THE PARTIES FURTHER AGREE THAT, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR ANY SPECIAL, INDIRECT, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

INDEMNIFICATION. To the maximum extent permissible by law, Client shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless RRM Design Group and its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees, agents, retained consultants, subconsultants, subcontractors, affiliates and representatives from and against any and all claims, demands, obligations, actions, suits, procedures, costs, expenses, damages, recoveries and deficiencies, injuries, liabilities or losses, including without limitation, interest, penalties, and reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, that arise from or relate to (i) the negligence, omissions, operations, or misrepresentations of Client or Client's contractors or other consultants, their respective officers, directors,



shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees, agents, affiliates and representatives with respect to the Project; or (ii) the default by Client hereunder excepting only those damages, liabilities or costs to the extent caused by RRM Design Group's negligent acts, errors or omissions, or willful misconduct as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

These indemnification provisions shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement and shall remain in full force and effect as long as permitted by applicable statutes of limitation.

INSURANCE. RRM Design Group shall obtain and maintain until completion of the services liability, property, and casualty insurance from a responsible insurer having minimum limits of not less than \$1,000,000.00 for general liability and \$1,000,000.00 for property and casualty losses for each occurrence and workers' compensation insurance in the amount of the statutory requirement. Client understands and acknowledges that RRM Design Group is not obligated to provide professional liability insurance.

TITLE. It is understood and agreed that all calculations, drawings, reports, specifications, documents, and data developed for the Project, including drawings, reports, and data on any form of electronic media, developed for the Project (collectively, the "Project Materials") shall be and at all times remain the property of RRM Design Group, who shall be deemed the author, and at all times shall retain all common law, statutory law, and other rights, including copyrights, whether or not the Project is completed. Client agrees to not transfer to others, use, or permit any other person to use the Project Materials, in whole or in part, for any purpose or project other than the Project, without the prior written consent of RRM Design Group, which may be withheld in RRM Design Group's discretion. Client further agrees to waive all claims against RRM Design Group resulting in any way from any unauthorized changes or reuse of the Project Materials for any other project by anyone other than RRM Design Group. Upon request and payment of all costs involved, Client is entitled to a copy of all final plans and specifications for use in connection with the Project for which the plans and specifications have been prepared. Client acknowledges that its right to utilize final plans and specifications and the services of RRM Design Group pursuant to this Agreement will continue only so long as Client is not in default, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, and Client has performed all of its obligations under this Agreement.

CLIENT RESPONSIBILITIES. Concurrent with the execution of the Agreement, Client shall provide RRM Design Group in writing with full information including a program setting forth Client's design objectives, constraints, and construction budget criteria as applicable.

In addition, Client shall provide all information it has access to that relates to the site and the Project that may in any way bear upon the services of RRM Design Group hereunder, including but not limited to, a legal description of the site, a recent site survey, a site plan, the location of utilities and underground structures at the site, previous technical reports, and any previous environmental assessments and/or audits.

At its sole expense, Client shall obtain all necessary authorizations and permits to allow RRM Design Group to have access to the site at reasonable times throughout its performance of this Agreement. RRM Design Group will take reasonable precautions to minimize damage to the site, but unavoidable damage or alteration may occur and Client agrees to assume sole responsibility for the same. Client agrees to assume sole responsibility for damages due to RRM Design Group's interference with subterranean structures, such as pipes, tanks, and utility lines, that are not correctly shown on the documents provided to RRM Design Group by Client or any third party.

Client further agrees that to the extent work on an existing site or facility requires RRM Design Group to make certain assumptions regarding existing conditions, and because some of these assumptions may not be verifiable without expending additional sums of money or destroying otherwise adequate or serviceable portion of the job site or facility, RRM Design Group may not be able to obtain complete information about existing conditions. To the maximum extent permissible by law, Client shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless RRM Design Group and its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees. agents, retained consultants, subconsultants, subcontractors, affiliates and representatives from and against any and all claims, demands, obligations, actions. suits, procedures, costs, expenses, damages, recoveries and deficiencies, injuries, liabilities or losses, including without limitation, interest, penalties, and reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, that arise from or relate to site conditions of which RRM Design Group has not been adequately informed.

Client shall furnish all legal, accounting, and insurance counseling services as may be necessary at any time for the Project, including auditing services Client may



require to verify the contractor's applications for payment or to ascertain how or for what purposes the contractor uses the moneys paid by Client. The information above shall be furnished at Client's expense and RRM Design Group shall be entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness thereof.

If Client observes or otherwise becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Project or nonconformance with this Agreement, prompt written notice shall be given by Client to RRM Design Group.

Client shall furnish information and shall review RRM Design Group work and provide decisions as expeditiously as necessary for the orderly progress of the Project and of RRM Design Group's services.

Client understands and acknowledges that if the scope of services includes RRM Design Group's assistance in applying for governmental permits or approvals, RRM Design Group's assistance shall not constitute a representation, warranty, or guaranty that such permits or approvals will be acted upon favorably by any governmental agency or be the only permits or approvals required for the Project.

STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE. The standard of care for all professional and related services performed or furnished by RRM Design Group under this Agreement shall be in accordance with generally accepted professional practice in the same or similar localities at the time the services are performed. RRM Design Group makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise in connection with RRM Design Group's services. Client acknowledges that changes to this Project inevitably will be required as a result of minor omissions, ambiguities, or inconsistencies in the plans and specifications, and therefore Client agrees to make no claim against RRM Design Group with respect to claims by the Project's contractors or others as a result of such omissions, ambiguities, or inconsistencies.

OPINION OF PROBABLE COST. Any evaluation of Client's budget for the Project, preliminary estimates or updated estimates of probable cost prepared by RRM Design Group represent RRM Design Group's opinion as an experienced and qualified professional generally familiar with the industry. It is recognized, however, that neither RRM Design Group nor Client has control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment, or services provided by others or over competitive bidding, market, or negotiating conditions. Accordingly, RRM Design Group cannot and does not warrant or represent that bids or negotiated prices will not vary from Client's

budget for the Project or any estimate or evaluation prepared or agreed to by RRM Design Group.

HAZARDOUS ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITION.

Client acknowledges that RRM Design Group's scope of services for this Project does not include any services related in any way to asbestos, PCB's, petroleum and/or hazardous or toxic materials (collectively, "Hazardous Materials"). Should RRM Design Group or any other party encounter any Hazardous Materials on the job site, or should it in any other way become known that Hazardous Materials are present or may be present on the job site or any adjacent or nearby areas which may affect RRM Design Group's services, RRM Design Group may, at its option, suspend or terminate work on the Project until Client: (i) retains a qualified contractor to abate and/or remove the Hazardous Materials; and (ii) warrants that the job site is free from any Hazardous Materials and is in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations. If no such action is taken by Client, RRM Design Group may terminate the Agreement. To the maximum extent permissible by law, Client further agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless RRM Design Group, its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, managers, members, employees, agents, retained consultants, subconsultants, subcontractors, affiliates and representatives from and against any and all claims, demands, obligations, actions, suits, procedures, costs, expenses, damages, recoveries and deficiencies, injuries, liabilities or losses, including without limitation, interest, penalties, and reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, that arise from or relate to any Hazardous Materials-related claims that may be brought by third parties.

ARBITRATION. Any controversy arising out of or pertaining to this contract, or its scope, interpretation, application, enforcement, or alleged breach, shall be resolved through binding arbitration. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, the arbitration shall be conducted in the County of San Luis Obispo, California, before a neutral arbitrator who is either a retired judge or an attorney licensed in California with a minimum of ten years' litigation experience. The arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of California Code of Civil Procedure §§ 1280 through 1294.2 and any successor provisions thereto, or any other rules the parties mutually agreed upon in writing. Any award of the arbitrator may be entered as a judgment in any court having jurisdiction. The parties understand that the results of the arbitration shall be binding upon them, and that they are waiving their rights to a trial by jury.



Either party may demand arbitration of any dispute by providing the other party with written notice of the claim, the basis therefor, and the name of a proposed arbitrator. Within ten (10) days of receipt of notice of a demand for arbitration, the recipient of said notice shall provide written notice to the other party of its response to said claim, the basis therefor, and either accepting the proposed arbitrator or providing the name of an alternative arbitrator. If the parties cannot mutually agree on a proposed arbitrator, either party may apply to the superior court for appointment of an arbitrator.

The parties shall share equally all initial costs of arbitration. The prevailing party shall be entitled to reimbursement of attorneys' fees, costs, and expenses incurred in connection with the arbitration.

LIENS. This Agreement shall not be construed to alter, affect, or waive any design professional's lien, mechanic's lien, or stop notice right which RRM Design Group may have for the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. Concurrent with Client's execution of the Agreement and from time to time thereafter as appropriate, Client shall provide in writing to RRM Design Group (i) the present name and address of the record owner of the property upon which the Project is located; (ii) the name and address of any and all lenders who may loan money on the Project and/or who are entitled to receive a preliminary notice.

SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS. All of the terms, conditions, and provisions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon Client, RRM Design Group, and their respective successors and assigns provided, however, that no assignment of this Agreement shall be made without the written consent of the parties to this Agreement.

FORCE MAJEURE. RRM Design Group is not responsible, and shall not be deemed in default, for delay caused by activities or factors beyond RRM Design Group's reasonable control, including, but not limited to, delays by reason of strikes, lockouts, work slowdowns or stoppages, accidents, acts of God, failure of Client to furnish timely information or to approve or disapprove of RRM Design Group's services promptly, or faulty performance by Client or other contractors or governmental agencies. To the extent such delays cause RRM Design Group to perform extra services, such services shall be paid for solely by Client in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

OTHER PROVISIONS. This Agreement together with the Prime Agreement represents the entire agreement between RRM Design Group and Client and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements,

either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both RRM Design Group and Client. All rights and remedies conferred under this Agreement or by any other instrument or law shall be cumulative and may be exercised singularly or concurrently. Failure by either party to enforce any contract term shall not be deemed a waiver of future enforcement of that or any other term. If any term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person, place or circumstance, shall be held to be invalid, unenforceable or void, the remainder of this Agreement and such term, provision, covenant or condition as applied to other persons, places and circumstances shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice, request, authorization, direction, or other communication under this Agreement shall be given in writing and delivered in person or by certified or first-class United States mail, properly addressed and stamped with the required postage to the intended recipient. The parties agree that they will execute such other instruments and documents as are or may become necessary or convenient to carry out the intent and purposes of this Agreement. All pronouns and any variations thereof shall be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine or neuter, singular or plural, as the identity of the person. persons or entities may require. All headings in this Agreement are inserted only for convenience and ease of reference, and are not to be considered in the construction or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement. Each individual executing this Agreement on behalf of a party hereto, by his or her signature, represents that he or she maintains full authority on behalf of the applicable party to execute this Agreement, and thereby bind the applicable party to all covenants, duties and obligations contained herein. This Agreement shall be construed as a whole, according to its fair meaning, and not in favor of or against any party. By way of example and not limitation, this Agreement shall not be construed against the party responsible for any language in this Agreement. The failure of either party, whether purposeful or otherwise, to exercise in any instance any right, power or privilege under this Agreement or under law shall not constitute a waiver of any other right, power or privilege, nor of the same right, power or privilege in any other instance. Any waiver by RRM Design Group must be in writing and signed by an authorized representative of RRM Design Group. Time is agreed to be of the essence with respect to this Agreement.





<u>City of Soledad 8th and Monterey Street Multi-Family Residential, General Plan and Zoning Amendment Mitigated Negative Declaration</u>




This project consisted of the preparation of a Mitigated Negative Declaration for a General Plan Land Use Map Amendment and related rezoning and proposed development for an approximately 2.8-acre vacant subject parcel. The General Plan amendment would change the land use designation from "Medium Density Residential (7 -12 units per acre)" to "High Density Residential (13-20 units per acre);" the corresponding zoning map amendment would rezone the site from the current R-2 Medium

Density Multi-family Residential District (7-12 units per acre) to the R-3 High Density Multi-family Residential District (13 - 22 units per acre). The rezoning would increase the maximum residential development potential on the site from 33 units, under the current R-2 District, to 61 units under the R-3 District. Under the direction of Mr. Oliveira, OEC prepared and

published the MND for this project, including a detailed analysis of traffic and circulation (i.e., railroad) impacts, noise impacts, and land use conflict impacts.

San Simeon Community Services District Planning and Environmental Review Services
Oliveira Environmental Consulting LLC currently provides planning and environmental review services for the San Simeon Community Services District on an as-needed basis. The wastewater reclamation project has received Title 22 approval from the California Department of Public Health and the reclaimed water will be available for the community as an alternative for landscape irrigation specifically excluding domestic and agricultural use. Under the direction of Mr. Oliveira, OEC prepared an environmental determination which included a Notice of Exemption for this project pursuant to CEQA.
- San Simeon CSD Wastewater Treatment Plant Unpermitted Rip Rap Project Coastal
- Development "After-The-Fact" Permit. Mr. Oliveira is currently assisting the SSCSD with the management of this permitting process, including addressing Coastal Commission information requirements and permit processing. This project includes the response to the on-going Coastal Commission violation case concerning the unpermitted installation at the existing




community WWTP. The unpermitted work includes the following components:

This has been an on-going permitting effort, culminating in the recent approval of the CDP at the July 2019 Coastal Commission Hearing. Since then, Mr. Oliveira has been assisting the SSCSD with meeting the requirements of the CDP Special Conditions which includes a comprehensive set of permitting conditions which will culminate in the required relocation of the WWTP.

<u>City of Pismo Beach South Silver Shoals Subdivision Development Project Mitigated Negative Declaration.</u>

Under the direction of Mr. Oliveira, OEC managed and prepared the Mitigated Negative Declaration for a recent subdivision project for the City of Pismo Beach. This included assisting

the City with staff report and public hearing support. The South Silver Shoals Subdivision project includes a request for a Coastal Development Permit, Conditional Use Permit and a Vesting Tract Map (VTTM 3043) for development of a 3.7-acre vacant parcel into a residential subdivision consisting of 9 custom home lots ranging in size from 5,100 square feet to 8,640 square feet and 10 town home lots ranging in size from 2,627 square feet to 4,507 square feet. OEC



prepared a peer review and field verification of previous biological assessments of the site and provided coordination with the technical reports prepared for the project including landscape plans, site remediation, bluff top erosion, City LCP policy requirements, noise analysis, and a visual impact study and photo simulations. In addition to preparation of the project MND, Mr. Oliveira assisted with the response to issues raised during the subsequent appeal of the project to the Coastal Commission.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

Based on discussions with SSCSD staff, our understanding is that the proposed project consists of a request by the SSCSD to activate solid waste authority for the community of San Simeon. The authority to provide for the collection and disposal of garbage and refuse matter currently resides with the County of San Luis Obispo.

When the SSCSD was formed, the provision of garbage collection and disposal services was not authorized by LAFCO under their authority. The District currently has the authority to provide road maintenance and water/wastewater services for its residents.

A CSDs active powers are determined by LAFCO. Government Code 61100 lists all the services that a CSD can provide to a community. Services/Powers that are latent must be activated through the LAFCO process as identified in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act.

Any district wishing to activate a latent power is required to receive LAFCO approval prior to providing the service. The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act also requires that the Protest Process be conducted by LAFCO. A vote of the District's residents is not needed to activate a power, unless the Protest Process indicates a vote is required by the registered voters.

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act directs that LAFCO consider the following key information in reviewing a request to activate a new or additional function/class of service:

- a. Whether the special district will have sufficient revenues to carry out the proposed new or different functions of class of services;
- b. Whether another local agency already provides substantially similar services or facilities to the territory where the district proposes to exercise that latent power;
- c. The Plan for Services to provide a new or different function or class of services.

With the exception of the County of San Luis Obispo, there is no other agency that can provide this service. In addition, the San Simeon area is not included within the sphere of influence of any other city or special district that currently provide this service.

The documentation and information requirements for the activation of latent powers include a Resolution of Application adopted by a CSD that contains all of the information specified for a petition (Government Code 56700), a Plan for Services pursuant to GC 56653, a 21-day notice prior to the hearing for adopting the Resolution, and filing of the LAFCO application and fees. If approved by LAFCO, the activation is subject to a Protest Process under.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The following scope of work is based on the example provided by SSCSD staff (Ground Squirrel Hollow CSD Solid Waste Authority Staff Report and Attachments) and provides a brief outline of the project management and environmental review tasks proposed for the SSCSD Activation of Solid Waste Powers discussed above.

Task 1: Final Project Input, Project Kickoff, Work Scope Refinement

Within one week from notification of scope approval, OEC's project manager will organize and attend a meeting and/or conference call with the SSCSD to discuss the details of the project, including information needs from the SSCSD and any early up-front input that may help to avoid delays and/or environmental issues that could result in project complications. The purpose of this discussion will be to review the project and proposed solid waste powers activation details. This will give the team an opportunity to finalize project details, milestones and information needs.

The meeting will also help solidify communication protocols and to affirm clear lines of communication between the SSCSD, regulatory agency staff and the OEC team. Based on the results of the kickoff meeting, we would be available to re-examine the proposed work program and make any revisions that the SSCSD may deem appropriate.

Task 2: Provision of Necessary Documents for Activation of Solid Waste Powers

Any district wishing to activate a latent power is required to receive LAFCO approval prior to providing the service. It is our understanding that the activation process includes the following tasks:

- 1) Resolution for Application to the Local Agency Formation Commission to Establish Solid Waste Collection Services. This includes the preparation and approval of a Resolution for adoption by the SSCSD Board of Directors for an application to LAFCO that specifies the District's desire for local control of solid waste services. OEC will work with the SSCSD staff and counsel to draft the Resolution for adoption and submittal to LAFCO.
- 2) **Plan for Services.** This is a required component of the application to LAFCO. Government Code section 56824.12 states the Plan for Services should include the following:
 - a. Total estimated cost to provide the new or different function or class of services.
 - b. Estimated cost of the new or different function or class of services to customers within the district's boundaries.
 - c. Identification of existing providers, if any and the potential fiscal impact to the customers of those existing providers.
 - d. Summary of whether the new or different function or class of services will be within all or part of the jurisdictional boundaries.
 - e. A plan for financing the establishment of the new or different function or class of services.
 - f. Alternatives for the establishment of the new or different function or class of services.

OEC will work with SSCSD staff to prepare the required Plan for Services, to be included with the application package to LAFCO for activation of solid waste authority.

- 3) **Agency Coordination.** As part of the LAFCO application process, the District would be required to supply information related to jurisdictional agency input regarding the proposal for activation of latent powers. This process includes the submittal of project referrals to applicable agencies, including but not necessarily limited to:
 - County of San Luis Obispo Planning Department;
 - County of San Luis Obispo Public Works Department;
 - CalFire; and
 - Air Pollution Control District (APCD)

In addition, agency coordination includes working with the SSCSD to investigate the concept of providing solid waste to the community, including a public meeting prior to proceeding with an application to LAFCO. OEC proposes to assist with the preparation of the necessary agency referrals and coordinate with the applicable agencies to meet

any information needs or address any questions or concerns. The result of the coordination process and referral responses will be summarized and reported in the LAFCO application submittal. This effort will also include a brief summary of past actions by local Districts for similar LAFCO applications.

- 4) Environmental Determination (CEQA Compliance). Because the application to LAFCO for the activation of latent powers is an act by the SSCSD with the potential for environmental impacts, the project would be subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). It is anticipated that this project would be covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. As such, this scope includes the preparation of a General Rule Exemption pursuant to the State CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3). OEC assumes that the SSCSD will submit the required Exemption to the County Clerk's Office for noticing, and will be responsible for payment of the required fees. OEC will provide staff with any necessary documents for public notice of the CEQA determination.
- 5) **Draft Resolution for LAFCO Approval of the SSCSD Application.** This includes the preparation of a draft Resolution for use by LAFCO conditional approval of the application from the SSCSD for the activation of solid waste services authority. OEC will work with the SSCSD staff and counsel to draft the Resolution for submittal to LAFCO.

Other Optional Tasks

In addition to the tasks discussed above, services may be requested by the SSCSD. Optional Tasks are not included in the attached cost estimate and would be performed on a time and materials basis in accordance with the OEC standard fee schedule, and any subcontractor work would be billed at a cost plus 15% rate.

Oliveira Environmental Consulting LLC will prepare all of the necessary tasks outlined above in accordance with this proposed scope of services for a fee not to exceed \$9,455.

Please refer to the cost estimate table below for more information. It should be noted that this cost is based on the following assumptions:

- No extraordinary or undeveloped issues are associated with the project that would suggest an effort greater than that described above;
- Any original graphics requested will be based on existing data supplied by either the SSCSD or their consultants;
- The tasks above were taken from the examples supplied by SSCSD staff (Activation of Solid Waste Power for the Ground Squirrel Hollow Community Services District). Any additional effort required by LAFCO not described above will be provided to the SSCSD on a time and materials basis, based on the OEC fee schedule.
- All documents will be submitted to the client in an electronic format;

The proposed scope of services and associated costs are fully negotiable to meet the needs of the San Simeon CSD. OEC invites any comments on this scope of work and will make changes

as requested. Mileage will be billed at the standard Federal rate allowed by the IRS for the current year.



Summary:


The inside of the reverse osmosis building needs to be painted to prevent drywall separation and deterioration.



Any alteration or deviation from the above specifications involving extra cost of materials or labor will become an extra charge over the sum mentioned in this contract.

No additions or deductions proposed by the owner after acceptance of this contract shall be binding upon the Painting contractor without approval in writing by him, or by his authorized representative.

GUARNATEE AND CLAIMS: The contractor guarantees his work against defects in workmanship and materials for a period of one (1) year from the date of the performance of such work provided that such defects are called to contractor's attention within thirty (30) days after the alleged defect has become apparent to be owner.

PERFORMANCE BOND: A performance bond will be supplied by the contractor if requested and paid for by the owner.

OVERTIME: Overtime work is not contemplated and may not be required as part of this contract without extra compensation to the contractor.

CONTINGENCIES: All agreements herein contained are contingent upon strikes, boycotts, accidents, inclement weather, earthquakes or other Acts of God which the contractor could not have reasonably foreseen or provided for or against.

CONTRACT PAYMENTS: The contractor shall not be required to proceed with the work if the payments have not been made as specified in the

NOTICE TO OWNER

THE LAW REQUIRES THAT BEFORE A LICENSED CONTRACTOR CAN ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH YOU FOR A WORK OF IMPROVEMENT ON YOUR PROPERTY, HE MUST GIVE YOU A COPY OF THIS NOTICE.

Under the mechanics' lien laws of the State of California, persons who help to improve your property and are not paid have a right to enforce their claims against your property. This "claim" is known as a mechanics' lien. Basically, when somebody files a mechanics' lien they are making claim on your property as security against payment of a just debt.

In other words, this law allows contractors, subcontractors, laborers, material men or certain others who may have provided goods or services to place a lien on your home or the structure they built or improved for you for any unpaid portion of the goods and services they furnish. For example, if you fail to pay your contractor, or if your contractor fails to pay his subcontractors or laborers, or neglects to make required contributions to a Trust and/or other funds (where applicable), then those people can look to your property for payment, EVEN IF YOU HAVE PAID YOUR CONTRACTOR IN FULL.

There are a number of ways to protect yourself and your property at the onset of contracting and throughout the construction project. You might, for instance, request that the contractor furnish you with a payment and performance bond. (This is a different bond than the one currently required by Contractors License Law). The additional cost is usually minimal and is a certain guarantee that the project will be completed and the bills paid. You may also with to record this payment or performance bond and file the contract with the Country Recorder to further protect yourself from anyone liening your property. If you do have a contractor provide a special bond on your project and the bonding company does not honor your claim promptly in the event the contractor defaults, you may wish to contact the California Insurance Commission to see if the bonding company is engaging in an unfair claims practice.

Another avenue available to you is to use a funding control company. The control company acts as a third party, disbursing all funds for payment and usually securing all the necessary releases of liens. A funding control company is a specialized construction escrow which makes payment directly to subcontractors and suppliers. By doing this, it affords additional protection against valid liens.

Should you choose not to use the above, the following are some of the important time requirements you should be aware of regarding the mechanics' lien law.

- 1. Preliminary Notice. A claimant, contractor, subcontractor, or material man is entitled to enforce a lien only if he gives the preliminary twenty (20) days notice, if applicable. All claimants, other than the original contractor (the person you contracted with), or a laborer performing actual labor for wages, must give this notice. Therefore, people who you may not even know, such as a subcontractor, or a material supplier, must notify you that they are providing supplies or services to your property with may later create a lien. This Preliminary Notice must be given no later than twenty (20) days after the claimant has first furnished labor, services, equipment or material to the job site.
- 2. Notice of Mechanics' Lien. Usually claimants must record the Notice and Claim of Lien within ninety (90) days of the completion of the work. If a Notice of Completion or a Notice of Cessation of Labor has been recorded, then the Claim of Lien must be recorded within sixty (60) days by the original contractor and within thirty (30) days by all other claimants such as subcontractors, material men, etc. The claimants must indicate on the notice what is owed to them. The lien will now bind your property like a mortgage or trust deed.
- 3. Complaint to Foreclose a Mechanics' Lien. If the claimants' demands are not satisfied, then they must usually file suit within ninety (90) days after the recordation of a Notice of Mechanics' Lien. The complaint to foreclose the lien is filed in a regular court proceeding and follows in a similar manner. YOU SHOULD BE AWARE THAT YOUR PROPERTY COULD BE SOLD AND THE PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE USED TO SATISFY THE CLAIM.
- A Notice of Non-Responsibility. You can protect yourself and your property from a valid claim of a contractor, or subcontractor who is doing work on your property, but not at your request (for example if you have a tenant who has contracted for work to be done). You can do this by posting and recording a Notice of Non-Responsibility. The notice must be posted in a conspicuous place within ten (10) days after you have obtained knowledge of the work. You must then record the notice at the County Recorder's office. You can usually purchase this form from various sources.
- 5. Unconditional Lien Release. You may also require that the original contractor provide you with unconditional lien releases signed by each and every person who has performed any work or labor as well as every person who has delivered any materials to your job. Be sure to get releases from each person who gave you a Preliminary Notice.
- 6. Notice of Completion. The owner of the property or his agent (sometimes the general contractor) can record a Notice of Completion within (10) days following the actual completion of the work of improvement. The effect of the Notice of Completion is to shorten the time period within which the contractors or subcontractors my file their Mechanics' Lien.

The above is not meant to be an exhaustive review of mechanics' lien. It is intended that you understand that you are entering into a contract which may bind your property and it is intended that you understand how to act to protect your property.

BUSINESS ACTION ITEM STAFF REPORT

Item 5.D. Discussion of the Water System Improvement Project Phase 1 Stage 1 tank analysis of contractor bid submittals provided by Phoenix Engineering. Discussion regarding whether to include the Water System Improvement Phase 2 tank installation as a part of Phase 1 projects.

Attached for review and discussion is the tank analysis of contractor bids provided by Phoenix Engineering. Based on this analysis, it appears that Crosno Construction is the lowest bidder for the work. However, the Crosno bid contained a few discrepancies that the District should consider when awarding the project. Crosno failed to provide unit pricing, but given that all bid items were lump sum, this is likely not a concerning omission. Crosno appears to have failed to correctly fill out the USDA Compliance Statement, so it is recommended clarification is sought regarding that form. As discussed above, one of Crosno's subcontractors has a suspended license. Clarification of the above item is also pending discussion with Crosno.

Given that the budget estimate for the Stage 1 items bid is \$950,000 and the highest bid actual for tank design and installation is \$650,100.00; Staff recommends that the Board may wish to consider installing a second 400,000 gallon tank as part of the Phase 1. Staff is looking for Board direction on Phase 1 Stage 1 of this project.

Dear Charlie-

On January 9, 2020, the District received two construction bids for the above project. As we discussed, I have reviewed the two bid packages and this letter summarizes my findings and recommendations.

The two contractors that submitted on the project are: Crosno Construction and Paso Robles Tank. The review process involved the following:

- Review the submitted bid package forms for completeness.
- Verify that the Addendum No. 1 through 4 paperwork was included in the bid.
- Review and verify the bid quantities and proposed costs.
- Review the status of the contractor's license and insurance on the State of California Contractor's State Licensing Board (CSLB) (www.cslb.gov).

I reviewed the low bidder package for Crosno Construction (Crosno) and Paso Robles Tank (PRT) to determine that the packages included the appropriate forms and are filled out correctly.

Crosno and PRT both submitted the completed bid packet with the relevant portions and forms filled out.

Bid Article 7.01 on page P-4, Item A requires that each bid must be accompanied by a bid security (Bid Bond). Crosno and PRT both submitted the bid bond form filled out, notarized surety documentation, power of attorney documentation, and signatory authority for the bid bond.

Bid Article 7.01 on page P-4, Item J requires that bidders shall be licensed in the State of California. I have attached the information that was listed on the California State Contractor's Licensing Board website. The information shows that Crosno is a licensed Class A General Engineering Contractor and the license is current through June 30, 2020. PRT also possesses a Class A license and is current through November 30, 2020. Note that updated license information should be sought from the awarded bidder during construction, as their license will likely expire during the duration of the Work.

Both acknowledged receipt of Addenda 1-4, with PRT submitting scanned copies of the addenda. Both Contractors included the required documents which were inserted by Addendum 4.

Both provided the filled out forms for information required of the bidder, including project references. See the attached sheet for a list of the references contacted and their responses. Of the five references contacted, two responded and verified that Crosno performed the project, verified

their contract amount, completed the work, and whether Change Orders were initiated.

Crosno and PRT both provided the required list of subcontractors and suppliers per Bid Article 7.01, Items B and C. Both Contractors indicated subcontractors would be utilized, and the license information of their subcontractors was checked. It was noted that one of the subcontractors listed by Crosno (Richard Gorham Construction) had a suspended license due to failure to comply with a bond payout as indicated by the CSLB website as of 1/14/20. Upon a subsequent check on 1/21/20, the license had been reinstated.

Both submitted the required Noncollusion Agreement provided on page P-14; the Verification of Department of Industrial Relations Registration on page P-15; the USDA Compliance Statement on page P-16; the Notice to Prospective Subcontractors of Requirements for Certifications of Non-Segregated Facilities on page P-17; the Certification Regarding Debarments, Suspension, Ineligibility and Voluntary Exclusion – Lower Tier Covered Transactions on page P-18; the Certification for Contracts, Grants and Loans (as modified in Addendum 4), and the Statement for Loan Guarantees on page P-26.

Note that Crosno may not have correctly filled out the USDA Compliance Statement on page P-16. Items 3 and 4 on that form are to be filled out if the contract is for more than \$50,000 and the bidder has 50 or more employees, and the form contains a response to Item 4 but not Item 3.

Both Contractors submitted qualification statements and supporting data as required by Bid Article 7.01, Item K.

I have verified the line item calculations and the totals for both Bidders. It should be noted that Crosno did not provide unit pricing in their bid and only filled out the totals for each bid item. The total bid amount submitted by the Bidders are as follows:

Based on the information provided, it appears that Crosno Construction is the lowest bidder for the work. However, the Crosno bid contained a few discrepancies that the District should consider when awarding the project. Crosno failed to provide unit pricing, but given that all bid items were lump sum, this is likely not a concerning omission. Crosno appears to have failed to correctly fill out the USDA Compliance Statement, so it is recommended clarification is sought regarding that form. As discussed above, one of Crosno's subcontractors has a suspended license. Pending this clarification, it is recommended that the District award the project to Crosno Construction.
